SMOKE DETECTORS, FIRE ALARM, AND OUTSIDE FIRE ALARM PULL BOXES AND EXTINGUISHERS

Every unit has smoke detectors in each room that



will sound if you have smoke in your unit.

The smoke detectors in your unit are your responsibility to keep in good operating order. If you have a fire in your unit, your smoke detector should go off. If there is a fire in your unit, you should go to the outside



walkway and pull down the handle on one of the red fire alarm boxes (there are four of these in each building, located at the ends of the upstairs and downstairs walkways).

This will automatically sound the building-wide fire alarm



located in your great room, and contact our monitoring service who will

immediately contact the fire department to come to Belle Haven.

There are 6 fire extinguishers located in the outside walkways in each building; these are heavy and should be used with caution.

The elevators in our buildings may be disabled during a fire. You will know this if the elevator door does not open. Anyone who is handicapped or has trouble navigating the stairs should make arrangements with a neighbor in their building to assist them down the stairs during an emergency. Neighbors, please reach out to anyone you think would need assistance and make arrangements to help them during an emergency.

RECYCLING & BULK PICKUPS

It's good to see that more people are using the recycling bins. However, to make sure we have enough room in the bins between weekly pickups, **please make sure to flatten your boxes (even small ones; put larger flattened boxes next to / in between the bins) and any plastics that can be flattened.** Please put only those items that are allowable recyclables in the bins (listings on the tops of the bins, and on the next page of this newsletter). If the bins are full at one dumpster, please take your recycling to another dumpster.

Bulk items (like mattresses, tables, chairs) are not allowed to be left in the dumpster areas. If you have something that needs a bulk pickup, call Whitney Buss at Coastal, 904-471-6606, ext. 115 and she will make arrangements, and give you instructions, for Advanced Disposal to pick up those items for a nominal fee.

- Plastics #1 thru #7
- Aluminum, steel & tin cans
- Glass jars & bottles
 - **Plastics, cans, & glass jars should be rinsed free of food.**
- Cardboard, paper cartons & paperboard (like cereal boxes)
- Paper, junk mail & phone books (NO PAPER TOWELS)

DO NOT PUT IN RECYCLING:

- Plastic bags (like Publix Bags)
- Styrofoam (like egg cartons)
- Aerosol cans
- Electronics, Wire & Hangers
- Yard Waste
- Pizza Boxes
- Hazardous Waste (like Oil, Oil Cans)
- Medical Waste
