## BARBEQUE GRILLS IN BELLE HAVEN

There are two grills in our complex. One is located in within the pool enclosure area, and one is located in the cul-de-sac area between Buildings 116 and 120. These are for the use and enjoyment of those living in Belle Haven, but please remember to turn

off the gas, clean the grill after you are done, and cover up the grill after it is cooled off. This will help keep the grills in good operating order. Thank you!

## INFORMATION TO VOTE BY MAIL

With the increase in Covid-19 cases, you may be thinking you'd like to vote by mail-in ballot. Voting by mail-in ballot is allowed in the state of Florida. You do not have to have a special reason to vote by mail but you do have to request your mail-in ballot well ahead of any election. Upcoming election dates are the August 18<sup>th</sup> Democratic Primary Election, and November 3<sup>rd</sup> for the General Election. A vote-by-mail ballot has to be requested no later than 5 p.m. on the 10<sup>th</sup> day before the election, but can be requested / sent to you up to 40 days before the election. The signed, mailed-in ballot must be received by the Supervisor of Elections no later than 7 PM on Election Day for the mail-in ballot to count. ### JULY NIGHT SKY

According to the Farmer's Almanac, July will be one of the most exciting months to view the planets in the night sky. Jupiter and Saturn will move in tandem across the sky during the month; you will have a good view of them alongside the Moon on the 5<sup>th</sup> of July; watch as it climbs in the southeast sky.

Mars will increase in size and brightness as the month progresses and will be visible

during the second half of the night during July.

The almost full Buck Moon will be spectacular on July 4<sup>th</sup> and can perhaps help replace some of the fireworks we may not have this year. The moon will be completely full on the 5<sup>th</sup>, and it will appear full for the few days after that. Venus will outshine Jupiter in the night sky on July 10<sup>th</sup>, but you'll have to get up about 2 hours before sunrise to see it! Mars can be seen around 1 AM, starting with July 12<sup>th</sup>, on the eastern horizon on the upper right of the Moon and will brighten visibly toward the end of July.
