HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

We are into the Atlantic Hurricane Season (June 1st through November 30th). Be prepared:
-We are in Evacuation Zone B. Here's a link to the Evacuation Zone Map that you can print: <https://www.sjcemergencymanagement.com/pdf-maps/evaczones%208x11.pdf>
-Assemble an emergency kit. See Page 9 of the Hurricane Guide for putting together an emergency kit.
-Develop or review a family disaster plan. Identify meet-up location; how to contact one another.
-Make sure your home, vehicle, and flood insurance policies are up-to-date and have copies of

them in a water-proof pouch to take with you. -Sign up for emergency mobile or text alerts on your cell phone.

Don't forget to secure, or bring in, any furniture on your patios.

DOG DAYS OF SUMMER

We are in the dog days of summer! These hot, humid days this year run through August 22nd. Take your walk early or late in the day, or enjoy cooling off in the pool! Historically, these "dog days" were the period following the rising of the star Sirius (often called the dog star). Sirius is the brightest star in the night sky located in the Canis Major constellation. Hellenistic astrology connected the rising of this star with heat, drought, sudden thunderstorms, lethargy, fever, mad dogs, and bad luck! These dog days are just the hottest, most uncomfortable part of summer in the Northern Hemisphere. On to September!
