by President George W. Bush to make the Friday after the attacks, September 14<sup>th</sup> 2001, a National Day of Prayer and Remembrance for those victims. A year later, September 11<sup>th</sup> was made a national day of mourning, and referred to as Patriot Day. This observance has been proclaimed annually since 2002, and a moment of silence is observed at 8:46 AM.

In 2009, President Barack Obama rededicated this day as Patriot Day and National Day of Service and Remembrance, with the flag being flown at half-mast on all United States government buildings and establishments.

Many organizations hold memorial ceremonies to honor the victims of 9/11.

TROUT CREEK GUIDED KAYAK TRIPS

On Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, September 10, 11, 12, and 13, 2020, the St. Johns County Parks & Recreation Department is offering guided kayak trips on Trout Creek. This is a chance to explore the history and diverse wildlife of Trout Creek. The trips are led by county naturalists, and the tours will depart from Trout Creek Park at 10:00 a.m. and return at 1:00 p.m. Trout Creek Park is located at 6795 Collier Road in St. Augustine, FL 32092. The cost of the tour is \$30 per person (\$20 for St. Johns County residents) for people bringing their own kayaks and \$50 per person

(\$40 for SJC residents) for those using a county kayak. Pre-register by calling 904-209-0355.
