CLUBHOUSE TO REOPEN

The Clubhouse will be reopening in the next couple of weeks. The Clubhouse will not be available for use by residents or groups during the times when Coastal employees are on-site (Monday - Wednesday, 8 AM - 1 PM; Thursday, 8 AM - 5 PM, and Friday, 8 AM - 1 PM), except to handle Association business with Linda Skinner in the Clubhouse Office.

A numbered key, unique to the Owner / Unit that cannot be duplicated, can be requested by, and issued to, only the Owner of a Unit. To obtain the key, the Owner must sign for it indicating they will follow CDC Guidelines and applicable federal, state, or local laws and orders related to Covid-19, and

that the Association does not guarantee the Clubhouse to be free from any virus, communicable disease, or otherwise (as the Association has established for the Pool and Exercise Room). The key, if lost, would have to be replaced at a cost of \$50.00 to the Owner. These keys will be available from Linda at the Clubhouse Office on Thursdays between 1 - 5 PM.

SATURDAY, MAY 1ST. INAUGURAL FOOD TRUCK FESTIVAL

Explore the delicious world of food trucks at this fun and tasty one-day festival. The festival will be held at Francis Field, 14 Castillo Drive in historic downtown, on Saturday, May 1st from 11 AM – 8 PM. The St. Augustine Food Truck Festival will include more than 20 food trucks as well as a full bar area with local spirits and specialty drinks. In addition to the food trucks there will be music, workshops, and kids' activities.

SATURDAY, MAY 1ST CLASSIC CAR MUSEUM – CRUISERS CAR & TRUCK SHOW

The Classic Car Museum will be hosting a FREE car show outside on Saturday, May 1st, from 9 AM – 2 PM. There will be a wide variety of cars and trucks on display outside the Museum. The Museum is located just south of BH on Route 1 and houses and displays restored antique cars from the 1910s through the hot rods of the 50s and 60s. Most were private cars, but some fire trucks and other service vehicles are also on display. The Museum is regularly open Tuesday – Saturday, 10 AM – 6 PM. The charge to tour inside the Museum is \$12.00 / person.

SKYWATCHERS

Two big celestial events happen during May. The year's largest appearing and brightest Supermoon, the "Super Flower Moon", will be on May 26th. The supermoon will coincide with a total Lunar Eclipse during which our moon will turn a reddish-orange color for 15 minutes during the early morning hours of the 26th. We will only see a little bit of it here in St. Augustine 😞, mostly visible in the western U.S. Also, an unbelievably bright Venus will be seen in the post-sunset sky during May and throughout the summer. A rare view of Mercury in the "Seven Sisters" star cluster (05/04 just after sunset, low northwest horizon), and a beautiful crescent Moon will be visible just next to Mercury, and above Venus (05/13 just after sunset).
