BELLE HAVEN ANNUAL MEETING – THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 17TH

The Belle Haven Annual Meeting will be held on Thursday, November 17th, beginning at 6:00 PM. You may attend the meeting in person at the clubhouse or via Zoom. You should have received the first notice of this annual meeting; a second notice will be mailed on November 3rd with a proxy (to establish a quorum for the meeting to make it official) a voting ballot, ballot envelope, and a signature envelope.

1. Proxy – all owners should submit a proxy even if planning to attend (we all know things can come up). Zoom participants **must** send a proxy to be counted as in attendance at the meeting.

2. Ballots - select 5 from the 6 candidates, place ballot in the ballot envelope, seal and place in the signature envelope, sign and seal. **DO NOT PLACE PROXY IN BALLOT / SIGNATURE ENVELOPE; IT MUST BE SUBMITTED SEPARATELY.**

Returning options:

2. Both proxy and ballots (again, the ballot in separate signature envelope) can be mailed to Coastal, or put in their drop box outside the Coastal office at 3942 A1A South.
3. Both can be dropped off at the Belle Haven Office on November 10th or on November 17th prior to the meeting.
