One of the events on Wednesday, May 3rd, from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m., is five members of the Florida Storytelling Troupe who will relate stories about Florida men and women who helped shaped this state. It will be held, free of charge, on the lawn of the Ximenez-Fatio House.

Another event is this year's Paint-Out Event, with artists celebrating St. Augustine's architectural and coastal beauty, with representations of open spaces, landmarks, and buildings in areas of historic downtown or St. Augustine Beach. The exhibit opens on Friday, May 5th at 5:00 PM at the St. Augustine Art Association.

WORLD RED CROSS DAY

Monday, May 8th, is World Red Cross Day. This date is the anniversary of the birth of Henry Dunant (born in 1828), the founder of International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), who was a shared recipient of the first Nobel Peace Prize in 1901. The Red Cross is an international humanitarian movement with approximately 97 million volunteers, members, and staff worldwide. It was founded to protect human life and health, to ensure respect for all human beings, and to prevent and alleviate human suffering.

The American Red Cross was founded by Clara Barton in 1901. Clara Barton was a hospital nurse in the Civil War, a teacher, and a patent clerk.

The American Red Cross is a nonprofit humanitarian organization that provides emergency assistance, disaster relief, and disaster preparedness education in the United States. It is the designated US affiliate of the International Federation
